Barbara Corbató

Hello Local 56 Sisters and Brothers,

I am currently running for one of the two available Member at Large positions on the Local 56 Board. Many of you already know me, but I'd like to introduce myself to those of you who might not.

Currently, I am the Assistant Principal Viola of the Grand Rapids Symphony, where I have worked for over 30 years. During that time I have held a number of committee positions. I have served as a member and Chair of the GRS Orchestra Committee and co-Chair of GRS Negotiation Committees during the 2020-22 pandemic. Additionally, I also served as the ICSOM (International Conference of Symphony and Opera Musicians) delegate for the Grand Rapids Symphony from 2015-2022. From



2017-2022, I served as administrator of the ICSOM Conductor Evaluation Program. Other committees that I have served on are: GRS Music Director Search Committee, GRS President Search Committee, GRS Artistic Advisory Committee, and GRS Board of Directors. I also served as a Member at Large on the Local 56 Board during the Ray Gill era.

Additionally, I work playing various gigs in the area and chamber music on different local series. As an active private Viola teacher, music education is very important to me. Hello! I would like to introduce myself. My name is Frederick Mitchell, Jr, and I was born and raised in Grand Rapids, Michigan. While living in Grand Rapids, I retired from a prosperous business in the mortuary services, while still pursuing my music since the age of 12 years old.

I studied music and adventured into learning different instruments, where the love of a bass guitar became my choice to perfect. Along with vocals, I gained my experiences by performing with various groups of all musical genres, being booked in the 1980s through the l'Oreal Ross entertainment company in Troy, Michigan, with a group called Azz-Izz. We played all the big hotel circuits and other venues, also opening for known artists such as Peaches and Herb, Betty

LOCAL 56 ELECTION PROCEDURE

Nominations for the two available Member-at-Large positions on the Local 56 Executive Board closed on September 3, 2024, and there are four members running for office:

Barbara Corbató, Michael S. Doyle, Carsten Forester, and Frederick Mitchell, Jr.

Here is the timeline for our process:

October 2024: Candidate statements from each nominee appeared in the Fall 2024 Local 56 online newsletter, along with their photo.

November 19, 2024: All four candidates have been invited to speak at the Local 56 membership meeting, which begins at 4:30pm at the Masonic Center.

November 20, 2024: A ballot will be mailed to the home address of Local 56 active members. Note that, per our bylaws, inactive members are not eligible to vote in Local 56 elections. A return stamped envelope will be included in the mailing in order to make the voting process easier.

IMPORTANT NOTE TO ACTIVE MEMBERS! Please be sure that the Local 56 office has your current mailing address so that you will receive your ballot.

December 9, 2024: Completed ballots must be returned via mail, or in person to the Local 56 office, on or before this date.

December 10, 2024: Ballots will be tallied by the Election Committee at the conclusion of the 4:30pm Executive Board meeting. The results of the election will be communicated to the Local 56 membership that evening via email, and the term of office begins in January 2025.
