

## **UPDATE/MUSIC PERFORMANCE TRUST FUND**

We are thrilled to announce that Local 56 was given a big boost to our MPTF allotment. For the 2025-26 season, we have been granted \$20,447.79, nearly a 50% increase from the previous season! This will be used to fund live performances in our communities.

As a reminder, MPTF performances must be free and open to the general public. Musicians will need to identify a sponsoring organization who is willing to contribute 50% of the total fee before the application is made, plus sign a Terms & Conditions form and a W-9 form. Musicians would be paid for one rehearsal and the performance (at set rates), cartage, and a 6% payment into each musician's AFM pension account. If approved by the MPTF, they will cover the other 50%.

Applications are submitted to the MPTF by Secretary-Treasurer Paul Austin at least thirty days before the performance date.

There are MPTF events which can be funded without a 50/50 split from a sponsoring organization. The following would be available from MPTF, covered 100% by the Local 56 allotment:

Juneteenth (June 19, 2025) Black History Month (February 2026) Women's History Month (March 2026) Jazz Appreciation Month (April 2026) Music in the Public Schools (September 2025 to April 2026)

Last season, Local 56 applied for nearly fifty MPTF grants. We are pleased to report that all but one were fully funded by the MPTF.

#### **MEET OUR 2025 GRFM SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS!**

Congratulations to the winners of our GRFM Madura and Erickson Scholarships.

Alexander Chung is the winner of our \$600 Madura Scholarship. A junior at East Grand Rapids High School, he will use the prize money to attend Interlochen's Intensive Viola Week. Alexander performed the Opus 85 Romanze by Max Bruch and is a private student of Local 56 member Leslie Van Becker.





The winner of our \$850 Erickson Scholarship is Iris Eppinga, a music major at Grand Valley State University. Her prize money will be given to Guarneri House towards a purchase of a double bass. Iris performed Sergei Koussevitzky's Chanson triste, is a private student of Local 56 member Mark Buchner, and the daughter of Local 56 member Alicia Eppinga.

The judges were Local 56 members Chris Martin, Jonathan Reed, and Kristen Shoup. This year, we offered to provide a pianist, Local 56 member Charles Hutchins, so that the cost of an accompanist would not deter students from entering the competition.

These scholarships, in memory of former AFM Local 56 members Robert Madura (GRS Principal Cellist) and Thomas A. Erickson (GRS Assistant Principal Bassist), are intended to further the musical education of deserving young musicians. Congratulations to Alexander Chung and Iris Eppinga, and a special thank you to the Local 56 members who made a donation to the GRFM Scholarship Fund.

Recently, there were times when AFM Local 56 showed up for rallies in Grand Rapids. Last March, the USPS Letter Carriers union held an event at Calder Plaza. Sponsored by the Kent-Ionia Labor Council, of which AFM Local 56 is one of their 33 members, the rally was one of



200 held nationwide in opposition of efforts to privatize the US Postal Service. I was happy to be joined by Local 56 board members Carsten Forester and Robert Johnson, plus Haijin Choi (Orchestra Committee Chair/GRS).
