CONGRATULATIONS TO CHRISTINA FONG 2025 "MUSICIAN OF THE YEAR"



We are pleased to present Christina Fong with the 2025 "Musician of the Year" award from AFM Local 56!

A member of our Local for 38 years, Christina joined the Grand Rapids Symphony in 1988 and was GRS Associate Concertmaster from 1996 to 2024. She remains a member of the GRS first violin section today.

Shown here receiving this award from Local 56 President Bennie Keys at our December board meeting, Christina is known for her tireless work for musicians. She has been a member of our Executive Board since 2017.

A specialist in new music, Christina has recorded over a dozen albums of rare works. She received a Fulbright Hayes grant to perform and teach in Belarus.

But Christina's activities goes beyond the concert stage. She is a recognizable figure at rallies in our community, campaigning for human rights. In addition, Christina earned an MA in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Western Michigan University. She works as a psychotherapist while pursuing a doctorate.

Our "Musician of the Year" award is presented annually to a member for their dedicated service to the Local and our community. Recent awardees include Kevin Dalton-Jones "Bujo" in 2024 and Dr James Sawyer in 2023.

MUSIC PERFORMANCE TRUST FUND BLACK HISTORY MONTH

We are thrilled to announce that Local 56 has been awarded eleven MPTF grants for live performances by our members during Black History Month.

The Local 56 bands who have received this MPTF funding include The Back Door Blues Band, Asamu Johnson & The Associates of the Blues, GR Just Us Band, Just Friends, and Murphy's Law.

The sponsors of these events during Black History Month are Alano Club of Kent County, Alano Club South of Kent County, The Candied Yam, Chicago Beef Joint, Dégagé, Grand Rapids Media Initiative & Film Incubator, Hero's Corner, Lead Exchange Network, and MVillage. As a reminder, MPTF performances must be free and open to the general public. Applications are submitted to the MPTF by Local 56 Secretary-Treasurer Paul Austin at least one month before the event. Contact him for more information.

The MPTF season runs from May 2025 to April 2026, and Local 56 has been very fortunate to have received over thirty MPTF grants this year. In fact, we are extremely lucky in that these awards for Black History Month exceed our allotted funds for the year. Thank you very much, Music Performance Trust Fund!



OUR 2026 GRFM SCHOLARSHIPS

Three scholarships designed to further the musical education of deserving young musicians are offered through our program and are in memory of former AFM Local 56 members Robert Madura (GRS Principal Cellist), Thomas A. Erickson (GRS Assistant Principal Bassist), and Donald D. Armstrong (GRS Violinist).

The \$600 Madura String Scholarship is available to violinists, violists, cellists, and harpists, and the \$850 Erickson Scholarship is available to double bass players. Determined by audition, these scholarships are for musicians ages 15-21.

High school juniors may apply for the \$300 Armstrong Scholarship. Open to all instrumentalists, this award is based upon a recommendation from their school's music instructor.

These three awards may be used for summer study, either at a camp or privately, or for the purchase of an instrument or equipment. Applications must be submitted to our office no later than March 31st and will be available beginning February 1st on our website at <https://grandrapidsmusicians.org/resources/>

NOTES FROM OUR SECRETARY-TREASURER PAUL AUSTIN

Our recent membership drive reminded me of when I joined the AFM in the 1980's. My horn professor was Principal Horn of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, and he encouraged me to join so that he could recommend me for union jobs. He pointed out that belonging to the AFM would not guarantee me work, but it would make me eligible for work. So I took his advice and joined AFM Local 1/Cincinnati.

I was unsure as to what the AFM could do for me until two years later, when I filed a grievance as a member of another Local. That case took months, and it went all the way to arbitration. In the end, I won. However, without the Local covering the legal fees, I would not have been able to pay for the lawyer. As you would imagine, I am eternally grateful to the AFM for this benefit.

A number of musicians in our Local are also teachers, and I encourage them to follow the advice passed along to me by my former private teacher. Student members do not have to pay Federation or Local initiation fees to join, but they are responsible for annual membership dues: \$156.00. For more details, go to GrandRapidsMusicians.org and share this information with promising music students.
